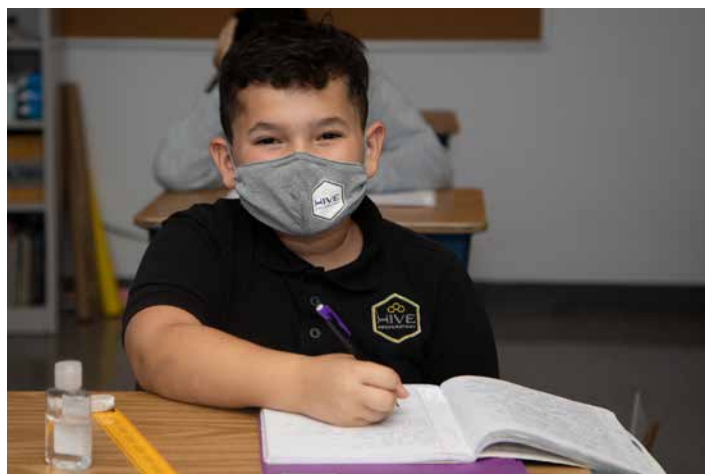
HIVE SUMMER LEARNING PROGRAMS

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and its lingering effects, teachers and administration across the country are expecting to see a learning loss in students. From necessary quarantining and isolation to the stress of a global emergency, it's not hard to imagine how children and teens have been impacted. In particular, the pause of face-to-face instruction in schools has negatively impacted several students. Therefore, HIVE is taking action. Coming out of two unprecedented school years, HIVE Preparatory School has recognized this potential learning gap and has already started addressing it through various summer learning opportunities.

By analyzing academic grades, diagnostic assessments (i-Ready, etc.), and standardized assessments (FSA, EOC, etc.), HIVE was able to provide targeted students with specific summer programming as needed. Teachers were able to create specific summer programming aligned to target each student's needs. Families with a student needing additional support were contacted mid-June and offered a summer school plan. Additionally, students who didn't specifically need additional support were also offered to attend at a parental request and given there was space available. HIVE was intentional to do everything possible in order to provide programming to any and all interested families.

Over the summer, HIVE staff and students worked hard to respond to the potential COVID-19 learning loss. From June 28 to Aug. 6, six different programs were offered:

- Summer School
 - 2nd and 3rd grade students met five days a week
 - A traditional (in-person only) summer school program focused on reading and language arts. Lunch was also provided.
- Summer Small Groups (Math and/or Reading)
 - K, 3rd and 5th grade students met four days per week
 - Offered as in-person and virtual with a focus on specific math/reading deficiencies and trends.



- Summer Camp Enrichment
 - K-5th grade students met two to three times per week for 45 minute sessions
 - Students within summer camp participated in small group lessons with a classroom teacher. Summer camp scholarships were provided for selected students.
- Middle School Course Recovery
 - Middle school students met five days per week
 - Traditional in-person classroom program for students with specific final grade course failures
- Middle School Math and Science Mastery Program
 - 6th and 7th grade students met five days per week
 - In-person program that focused on content mastery. This was for subjects (math, science) that needed additional time to be taught due to the difficulties faced last school year.
- Summer Read-Along
 - K- 4th grade students met once per week for a 30-minute session
 - A classroom teacher read portions of the summer reading books to the appropriate grade level via Blackboard Collaborate. Students were invited to read along with the teacher and discuss topics and ideas from the books or passages.

Through these six different summer programs, HIVE has been able to intentionally start addressing the potential learning loss due to COVID-19. Students who took advantage of these programs are now one step further in their education journeys and ready to take on the new school year.
