## **OLD BUSINESS:**

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

Mrs. Zequeira introduced the agenda and indicated that the key topic would be introducing HIVE's results regarding the 2022-2023 end of year FAST and EOC assessments, as well as current PM1 data. The school's plan of action in targeting deficiencies will also be discussed. Additionally, the agenda includes introducing the new EESAC board.

#### SIP:

Examining data, HIVE determined the areas needed to be addressed the most are grades 3-8 ELA proficiency.

Principal Jennifer Zequeira shared data from last year's end of the year FAST and STAR assessments. HIVE earned 89% of the possible points... our highest total ever! Reading averaged 82 percent proficiency and 91 percent proficiency in math – with 6th grade math at 93 percent. Also, STAR assessment scores for grades K through 2 revealed HIVE's kindergarteners exhibited the highest growth in Miami-Dade County from the baseline to the final assessment administered in April. Finally, all 80 7th and 8th graders who took the Algebra EOC passed while the students on the state and district level passed with a rate in the lower 50s.

Mrs. Zequeira then shared current PM1 data and reminded everyone that this information is preliminary and used only as a baseline score. Each progress monitoring test covers the full "test blueprint", meaning that all content expectations for that subject and grade level are assessed. With that, Mrs. Zequeira said that they have already started workshops, a 30-minute small group intervention, to begin targeting most deficient areas from PM1 and will continue to monitor progress using classroom assessments, such as Unit Assessments in reading and Topic Tests in Math.

Mrs. Zequeira opened the floor for input regarding the School Improvement Plan. There was no motion for changes or objections, the community of parents and teachers did celebrate and thank the school for its continued academic achievement.

#### **EESAC Board**

Mrs. Zequeira recognized the EESAC board in attendance with the parent representatives: Jennifer F, Trimika B., Monica A, Raisa A, and Noriel's mom. Jennifer Maya-Munne was also recognized for her dedication as the EESAC Chair.

Mrs. Zequeira opened the floor for input regarding the EESAC Board. No comments were made.

# Parent and Family Engagement

Mrs. Zequeira opened the floor to discuss upcoming events. Spooky Hallway with a Mad Scientist Twist is taking place on Thursday, October 26th, this is one of HIVE's biggest events, and volunteers are still needed.
